

2019 NINTH CIRCUIT CIVICS CONTEST




The United States Courts for the District of Montana are proud to announce the winners of the 2019 District of Montana civics contest. High school students from around Montana submitted video and essay entries addressing the contest's theme of "The 4th Amendment in the 21st Century - What is an 'Unreasonable Search and Seizure' in the Digital Age?" The winners were selected by a panel of judges consisting of practicing attorneys and federal court personnel. The top three entries in each category will receive cash scholarships and go on to compete in the Ninth Circuit-wide competition, where they will have the opportunity to earn additional scholarship awards.
