ORDER AMENDING UNIFORM
COLLATERAL FORFEITURE
SCHEDULE FOR MISDEMEANOR
OFFENSES COMMITTED WITHIN
THE JURISDICTION OF GLACIER
NATIONAL PARK IN THE
DISTRICT OF MONTANA

IT IS ORDERED that the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule of the National Park Service for Glacier National Park effective June 12, 2013, is amended to include the following rules under 1.4 and 1.5 regarding the use of Unmanned Aircraft in the Park:

SECTION 1.4 DEFINITIONS:

Unmanned Aircraft (UAS) is any device that is used or intended to be used for flight in the air without the possibility of direct human intervention from within or on the device, and the associated operational elements and components that are required for the pilot or system operator in command to operate or control the device (such as cameras, sensors, communication links). This term includes all types of devices that meet this definition (e.g., model airplanes, quadcopters, drones) that are used for any purpose including recreation commerce.

SCANNED

SECTION 1.5 CLOSURES AND PUBLIC USE LIMITS

(a)(1) The following schedule of visiting hours, public use limits, and area closures are established for reasons of public health and safety, protection of environmental and scenic values, and protection of natural and cultural resources:

vii) Unmanned aircraft

a) 1) Launching, landing or operating an unmanned aircraft from or on lands and waters administered by the National Park Service within the boundaries of Glacier National Park is prohibited except as approved in writing by the superintendent

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the collateral for a violation of this regulation is \$250.00.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this amendment to the current Collateral Forfeiture Schedule is effective as of the date of this Order.

A) To protect wildlife the following activities are prohibited:

1) Willfully approaching, remaining, viewing, or engaging in any activity within 100 yards of bears or wolves, or within 25 yards of any other wildlife including nesting birds; or within any distance that disturbs, displaces, or otherwise interferes with the free unimpeded movement of wildlife, or creates or contributes to a potentially hazardous condition or situation.

2) Failure to remove one self to prescribed distances during inadvertent, accidental, casual or surprise encounters with wildlife.


3) Failure to comply as directed by NPS staff (employees, volunteers, or agents) engaged in administering wildlife management operations or managing wildlife viewing opportunities.

4) The prohibitions in this paragraph do not apply to persons who are in compliance with written protocol approved by the Superintendent; in accordance with the terms and conditions of a permit from the Superintendent or park personnel acting within the scope of approved management activities.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the collateral for a violation of this regulation is \$100.00.

IT IS FURHTER ORDERED that this amendment to the current Collateral Forfeiture Schedule is effective as of the date of this Order.

Comes now the United States, by and thru Kris A. McLean,
Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Montana, and moves this
Court to amend the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule for Central Violation
Bureau violations occurring in Glacier National Park on the following
grounds and for the following reasons:

This Court recently issued an order adopting the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule for Central Violation Bureau violations occurring in Glacier National Park. Subsequent to that order, the Superintendent of Glacier National Park completed the Administrative Rule Process and finalized a very important rule regarding the protection of wildlife in Glacier National Park as follows:

A) To protect wildlife the following activities are prohibited:

1) Willfully approaching, remaining, viewing, or engaging in any activity within 100 yards of bears or wolves, or within 25 yards of any other wildlife including nesting birds; or within any distance that disturbs, displaces, or otherwise interferes with the free unimpeded movement of wildlife, or creates or contributes to a potentially hazardous condition or situation.

2) Failure to remove one self to prescribed distances during inadvertent, accidental, casual or surprise encounters with wildlife.

3) Failure to comply as directed by NPS staff (employees, volunteers, or agents) engaged in administering wildlife management operations or managing wildlife viewing opportunities.

4) The prohibitions in this paragraph do not apply to persons who are in compliance with written protocol approved by the Superintendent; in accordance with the terms and conditions of a permit from the

Superintendent or park personnel acting within the scope of approved management activities.

However, the Superintendent of Glacier National Park does not have the authority to set collateral for this violation. Rather, the United States respectfully requests this Court set the collateral for a violation of this regulation at \$100.00. For the Court's information, this violation would fit into the previously approved Collateral Forfeiture Schedule under Section 2.2 Wildlife Protection.

Wherefore the United States respectfully requests this Court issue an order amending the Collateral Forfeiture Schedule for Central Violation Bureau violations occurring in Glacier National Park to add the Superintendent's recently enacted rule set forth herein and set the collateral for violating that rule at \$100.00.


