Transcript page rates currently in effect pursuant to the Judicial Conference of the United States.

30-Day Transcript (Ordinary) A transcript to be delivered within 30 calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$4.00	\$1.00	\$0.70
14-Day Transcript A transcript to be delivered within 14 calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$4.70	\$1.00	\$0.70
7-Day Transcript (Expedited) A transcript to be delivered within seven calendar days after receipt of an order.	\$5.35	\$1.00	\$0.70
3-Day Transcript A transcript to be delivered within three calendar days after receipt of order.	\$6.00	\$1.20	\$0.85
Next-Day Transcript (Daily) A transcript to be delivered on the calendar day following receipt of the order (regardless of whether that calendar day is a weekend or holiday), prior to the normal opening hour of the clerk's office.	\$6.70	\$1.35	\$1.00
2-Hour Transcript (Hourly) A transcript of proceedings to be delivered within two (2) hours from receipt of the order.	\$8.00	\$1.35	\$1.00
Realtime Transcript A draft unedited transcript produced by a certified realtime reporter as a byproduct of realtime to be delivered electronically during proceedings or immediately following receipt of the order.	One feed, \$3.40/page Two-four feeds, \$2.35/page per feed Five or more feeds, \$1.65/page per feed **Orders placed on or before the day of the proceeding will be batched together for purposes of determining the number of feeds; and subsequent orders will be charged at the lowest page rate assessed on the previous orders.		

- The above rates are applicable to each page of transcript, excluding the certification page which must be at the end of each volume of transcript.
- Electronic transcripts are at the same maximum rates authorized for paper transcripts, as long as a copy is produced, certified, and filed with the Clerk of Court.

Transcript delivery dates are computed from:

- The date on which satisfactory financial arrangement is made, except for transcripts to be paid for by the United States;
- The date on which the court order is provided to the reporter or transcriber when a transcript has been ordered by a judicial officer; or
- The date set by a scheduling order issued by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.
